**Program Abstract** Paradigm Shift in Daily Life

In recent years, people began to discuss postmodern paradigms through use of such terms as constructivist, hermeneutics, complex systems and quantum worldview. The New Science Movement is also in progress with an attempt to combine science from the Western tradition and mental tradition from the East to produce new useful knowledge. Alternative medicine/healing, conscious power in connection with the Uncertainty Principle in quantum physics, development of new nervous systems in connection with euphoric excitement, the belief that a true vision attains itself in embodiment, recovery from illness is one's own plausible responsibility, are only a few of countless examples. What do you think of social science researchers who insist on scientific methodology and objective information?

This workshop reexamines our perceptual process through experiential co-learning of such matters as analog and digital informatization, critical significance of euphoric excitement and disheartening depression, and the ways of animating imagination and vision.
